Strengthening Relationships Between Children and Caregivers on a Regional Level: United Way of Greater New Haven's "Secure Start" Initiative

Launched in 2013 under the umbrella of United Way of Greater New Haven's (UWGNH) Success by Six effort, the goal of "Secure Start" has been to impact the quality of early relationships between young children and their caregivers in its 12 -town region, which includes a high percentage of children living under the federal poverty level. With the understanding from attachment research that attuned early relationships can buffer the stress of poverty and challenging environments, while helping to put children on the road to success in learning and in life, it was decided that impacting these early relationships could be an important lever for improving outcomes for children in the region. Circle of Security-Parenting (COS-P) was chosen as the intervention because it is highly accessible, nonjudgmental, and has a relationship-based orientation. Since 2013 UWGNH has been granting funds to a variety of organizations that offer COS-PTM groups to caregivers and early educators, and has been providing professional support and a community of practice to the facilitators and agency directors.
